Whereas – MOCREEBEC EEYOUD is pursuing negotiations with the Government of Canada and the Government of Ontario for the formal recognition as a First Nation community and the establishment of their own community site in Ontario under the parameters of the James Bay Northern Quebec Agreement

And Whereas - MOCREEBEC EEYOUD has a history of living and working in the Moosonee and Moose Factory area for several centuries where they have established their roots with homes, businesses, services, and family traditions,

And Whereas - MOCREEBEC EEYOUD has been a good neighbor and partner with the Town of Moosonee and many MOCREEBEC EEYOUD members are currently residents of the Town of Moosonee

And Whereas - MOCREEBEC EEYOUD establishing its new home community within the Municipal boundaries in the Town of Moosonee would add the population of MOCREEBEC EEYOUD to the service area of the Town of Moosonee adding economy of scale to municipal services and the viability of additional business services to the larger community.

And whereas – the location, scope, parameters and size of the new MoCreebec Eeyoud community will be determined on the basis of a Comprehensive Community Plan (CCP) to be developed and completed by Community Planners in consultation with MoCreebec membership and Town of Moosonee.

And Whereas the establishment of service agreements for the provision, where feasible, of municipal services such as water, wastewater, landfill etc., would benefit both MOCREEBEC EEYOUD and the Town of Moosonee

Therefore be it resolved that: Should MOCREEBEC EEYOUD negotiations with the Governments of Canada and Ontario be successful and a relocation to a new site is endorsed and approved by all parties concerned, The Town of Moosonee invites and welcomes MOCREEBEC EEYOUD (MoCreebec people) to establish their new home within the boundaries of the Town of Moosonee.

And that: the Town of Moosonee Elected Council commits to working with MOCREEBEC EEYOUD in good faith and within the parameters established by the Federal and Provincial governments to establish MoCreebec community as neighbors and partners within the Municipality boundaries of Moosonee Town; with service agreements and understandings that will benefit all parties and residents and encourage the overall community as a whole to develop, grow, flourish and to prosper.
